Contact forms and Cookies

We obtain information about you when you use our website(s) for example, when you complete the contact form, or send an email to the address in our menu, this provides us with personal data such as your name and email address.

Google Analytics

Analytics cookies are used for us to compile reports on our website and give us guidance on how we to improve. We collect information about how our visitors use our website. This collection is anonymous. It will look at the numbers of visitors, the pages visited and how visitors are arriving on the website.

Who do we share your data with?

How long do we retain your data?

What rights do you have over your data?

You can request to receive an exported file of the personal data we hold about you, including any data you have provided to us. You can also request that we erase any personal data we hold about you. This does not include any data we are obliged to keep for administrative, legal, or security purposes. None of the data collected by Integrity Taxation is given to any third party.

What data breach procedures we have in place?
